DAY ONE AND TWO



DAY 1

You, as a participant, will be picked up by your local Marine Corps recruiter and taken to the airport where you will depart for Beaufort, S.C. Once you arrive at the hotel, a dinner will be hosted by the Marines that will accompany you through your journey and breakdown everything that you will experience in the coming days.

DAY 2

The day begins in true Marine Corps fashion, early. Your first introduction to Marine Corps Recruit Depot Parris Island will be the same way recruits are introduced, with the Yellow Footprints Drill. There you will not only learn about the different opportunities the Marine Corps has to offer, but also what it takes to become one of the World's Finest. Afterwards you will be afforded the opportunity to have lunch with recruits currently striving to become Marines, some may even be a former student of yours. Then you will go through the Indoor Simulated Marksmanship Trainer, which will train you for the next event, firing a live M16A2 service rifle on the rifle range. To cap off your day, you make a visit to Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort, where you will see Marines in action in life after boot camp, followed by dinner at the Fightertown Beaufort Officers' Club.



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DAY THREE AND FOUR

DAY 3

On the third day, you will witness recruits conducting their daily physical training routine in the morning. You will then be given a tour of a squadbay, to see where the recruits call home during their 13 weeks on Parris Island. After seeing the living area of recruits, you will gain inside knowledge of Marine Corps history at the Parris Island Museum. Next you will receive a brief on the 54-hour training evolution recruits go through, "The Crucible," and will be able to see recruits going through the Marine Corps' right of passage. You will have lunch with permanent personnel Marines to gain more insight of the life after boot camp. The last recruit training event you will be presented is the Marine Corps Martial Arts Program. Here you will be given the chance to participate in martial arts training and square off against a MCMAP instructor. This will be followed up by dinner at Traditions in Beaufort.

DAY 4

To start your final day, you will watch the MCRD Parris Island Band performing morning colors.

The grand finale to your trip will be the graduation, where they are no longer recruits, but Marines. You will then travel back to New

York, where your trip will end just like the beginning, with your local Marine recruiter waiting for you at the airport to pick you up.


