

Major Jonathan C. Glover graduated from North Carolina State University in December of 2001 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in History. Receiving his commission as a 2nd Lieutenant through the Platoon Leaders Course, he attended The Basic School, Quantico, VA from September 2002 - March 2003.

Completing Field Artillery Basic Officers Course in August 2003, Maj Glover was assigned to 1st Battalion, 10 Marine Regiment in Camp Lejeune, NC. From September 2003 to November 2005, he served as Forward Observer, Platoon Commander, Fire Direction Officer, and Liaison Officer for Battery C.



While deployed in support of Operation IRAQI FREEDOM (OEF), from October 2004 - April 2005, he was temporarily assigned to 2nd Reconnaissance Battalion as a Forward Observer during Operation Al Fajr (Phantom Fury) Fallujah, Iraq. In December 2005, he assumed the duties of Executive Officer for Weapons Co, 3rd Battalion, 8th Marines and deployed again in support of OEF to Ramadi, Iraq from February - September 2006.

After returning home, Major Glover reported to Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, South Carolina. From October 2006 - July 2009, Maj Glover served as Series Commander for Company I and Company Commander for Company L, 3rd Recruit Training Battalion; as well as Assistant Operations Officer, Recruit Training Regiment.

In August 2009, Maj Glover was ordered to 1st Battalion, 10 Marine Regiment once again. Initially serving as the Battalion Liaison Officer, he took command of Battery B in November 2009. From October 2010 – May 2011, the battalion deployed in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM (OEF). Battery B was assigned to Kajaki District, Afghanistan where it conducted the full spectrum of combat operations within its own battle space as well as provided fire support for adjacent units. Upon returning, Major Glover relinquished command and was assigned as the Battalion Logistics Officer. In October 2011, he assumed the duties as the Battalion Operations Officer.

Major Glover was selected to be the Commanding Officer of Marine Corps Recruiting Station, Cleveland, Ohio.

His personal awards include the Bronze Star Medal w/ V, the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal w/ gold star, the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal w/ V, and Combat Action Ribbon w/ gold star. He is married to the former Ms. Lisa M. Michalechen and has three children: Alec, Lillian, and Jacob.
