

SERGEANT MAJOR DANIEL G. BULLOCK

Daniel G. Bullock enlisted in the delayed entry program on the 29th of May 1985. Upon completion of recruit training, Private Bullock reported to 2nd AAV Battalion, 2nd Marine Division for on-the-job training as a field wireman September of 1986, after completion of Field Wireman Course, he reported back to 2nd AAV Battalion for his assignment as the CMS/CMCC clerk for the battalion. After two years, Lance Corporal Bullock was reassigned back to Communication Platoon as a Field Wireman/MIMMS Clerk and a radio operator. He went to Panama for jungle warfare from January to March of 1990 in support of the shooting of the barracks.

Corporal Bullock transferred to Headquarter and Service Company, Camp Courtney, Okinawa, Japan. He was assigned as Field Wireman/MIMMS Clerk where he deployed to Korea for Team Spirit 1991.

Corporal Bullock transferred to IRR in May of 1991, where he moved to Alaska and went through electrical program for two years before moving to Jacksonville, FL working for Florida Rock, Inc. as an Electrical Maintenance Man.

Corporal Bullock returned to active duty in February of 1995, he was assigned to MWHS-2, G-6 Cherry Point, North Carolina as an Administration Clerk, after a year he was assigned as the Admin Chief. Sergeant Bullock received orders to Drill Instructor School for July of 1997.

After completion of Drill Instructor School, Sergeant Bullock was assigned as a Drill Instructor for Company M, 3rd Battalion, MCRD Parris Island, South Carolina. In October of 1998, Staff Sergeant Bullock was assigned to Close Combat for his support billet. While there, he went to Quantico, VA for Close Combat Instructor Trainer course. Upon completion, he return to Close Combat for another 9 months of training recruits in hand-to-hand combat before returning back to Mike Company for his last Platoon as a Drill Instructor.

In July of 2000, Staff Sergeant Bullock reported to 7th Communication Battalion, 3rd Marine Division for assignment as Wire Chief/Platoon Sergeant, he returned to 29 Palms, California to Communication Chief Course after completion he return back to 7th Communication Battalion to deploy to Thailand for Cobra Gold 2001. In August of 2001 Staff Sergeant was handpicked to stand up the first Marine Corps Martial Arts Program at Division Schools where he was promoted to the rank of 1st Degree Black Belt Instructor Trainer. After a year he became the Chief Instructor for the Marine Corps Martial Arts School where he received the rank of 3rd Degree Black Belt Instructor Trainer.

In July 2003 SSgt Bullock reported to Recruiters School, Marine Corps Recruiting Depot San Diego, California. Upon graduation from Recruiters School, Gunnery Sergeant Bullock was

assigned to Recruiting Station Columbia, 6th Marine Corps District. He was assigned as a canvassing recruiter, Lexington, South Carolina and SNCOIC for Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. In October of 2006, Gunnery Sergeant Bullock reported to 1st Battalion 12th Marine Regiment, Kbay, Hawaii for duty. He was assigned as SNCOIC of a Police Transition Team in support of OIF of 8 months. Upon his return, he was assigned as the Headquarters Battery Wire Chief/Communication Chief. In January of 2008 he was frocked to the rank of First Sergeant where he took over Charlie Battery as the Battery First Sergeant. First Sergeant Bullock took Charlie Battery back over in support of OIF.

In June of 2009, First Sergeant Bullock reported to 3rd Force Recon Company, Mobile, AL as the Inspector and Instructor First Sergeant where he trained and prepared Reserve Marines for multiple deployments to OEF and Africa. In February on 2013 he was frocked to Sergeant Major and assigned to his current billet as Recruiting Station Sergeant Major, Recruiting Station Louisville, Ky, 4th Marine District

Sergeant Major Bullock's personal decorations include Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal with (3) gold stars, Combat Action Ribbon, Good Conduct Medal with silver star.

Sergeant Major Bullock is married and has three children.
