SUBJ: GUIDANCE FOR CYBER MISSION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022 AND BEYOND

Ref: (a) MCRCO 1100.2A, Officer Commissioning Manual
(b) MCRC FROST CALL 046-19

1. Purpose. To provide final selection board opportunity guidance to close out the Fiscal Year 2022 (FY22) Cyber Officer (1702) mission
2. Background. Reference (a) establishes the requirements, standards for eligibility, and program change process for all new Marine Corps Officer accessions. Reference (b) provides the current, approved Cyber Officer service agreements. As of FY21, Marine Corps Recruiting Command (MCRC) assumed the entire cyber accession mission, and MCRC Officer Programs (OP) established board processes to select new Cyber Officers across four different commissioning sources - United States Naval Academy, Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps (NROTC), Platoon Leaders Class (PLC), and the Marine Enlisted Commissioning Education Program (MECEP).
3. Information. To close-out the FY22 Cyber Officer mission, MCRC OP again will host a single board, commencing on or about November 1, 2021, for the NROTC and MECEP program changes. In addition to those programs, PLC program changes (FY22 only) will be considered on the same board. Only FY22 college graduates who can report to The Basic School between June and September of 2022, will be considered. Only MECEP has a cap; anticipated allocations are as follows: NROTC (5), PLC (5), MECEP (3).
4. Action. Marine Officer Instructors and Region Assistants for Officer Procurement must ensure timely, eligible, and accurate submission of Cyber Officer program change packages arrive at MCRC OP no later (NLT) than 21 October 2021. Ensure completed packages contain the applicable service agreement, provided in reference (b). MCRC OP will announce board results of the board NLT 25 November. Requests for Appointment (RFAs), for those selected on the FY22 Cyber Officer board, must be submitted NLT February 1, 2022. This provides ample time to appropriately slate them for TBS classes and Cyber Officer Course.
