4. Duties Performed: The basic mission of a Mobility Officer is to move MAGTFs in accordance with Commanders requirements. Technical requirements, as outlined in MCWP 5-1 and other doctrinal pubs, include:
 - Plans and conducts the strategic deployment of Marine and Joint forces by amphibious sealift (including the assault follow on echelon (AFOE)), strategic sealift/airlift, tactical airlift, and maritime prepositioning sealift.
 - Reviews deployment requirements.
 - Recommends the allocation of deployment lift resources.
 - Determines transportation feasibility.
 - Reviews strategic lift shortfalls and recommends adjustments to the MAGTF or Joint commander.
 - Develops and validates closure estimates using all modes of transportation, e.g., amphibious sealift (including the AFOE), strategic sealift/airlift, and maritime prepositioning shipping.
 - Implements MAGTF or Joint commander's movement plan from origin to final destination, by all modes of transportation, using deployment systems and in accordance with supporting/supported Combatant Commander validations.
 - Maintains technical liaison with transportation agencies, supported and supporting Combatant Commander's.
 - Prepares detailed loading plans for transportation resources (ships, aircraft, trains, trucks, etc.).
 - Prepares supplies and equipment for transportation (including preparation and certification of hazardous material) (including ammunition).
 - Plans, conducts and supervises embarkation training.

5. Required Schools/Courses: Newly appointed MOS 0430 Warrant officers will attend the MOS-required Mobility Officer Course (CID M03H347) at Marine Corps Combat Service Support Schools, (MCCSSS) Camp Johnson, NC, (Resident) upon graduation from WOBC.

6. Desirable MOS Progression Schools/Courses: This is an all-inclusive list of schools/courses; it should not be expected that applicants will have attended all, or even a majority of these. The intent is to show the scope of training which relates to billets filled by individuals holding this MOS.

9. Miscellaneous. An 0430 Warrant Officer is a technical specialist, requiring years of experience to become fully proficient in all facets of the MOS. An 0430 should be selected primarily from the 0431/0491/0481 MOSs. Recommended priority for selection:

- a. Those who have served in primary embarkation billets and have technical expertise in embarkation matters.
- b. MAGTF Planners that have worked as a MSE Plans Chief or at the MEF level or higher.
- c. Those who are best qualified for Warrant Officer.
