1. Purpose. To provide updated guidance on pre-ship screening requirements before shipping to Officer Candidates School (OCS) and reporting to The Basic School (TBS).

2. Background. Reference (a) directs Officer Selection Officers (OSOs) and Marine Officer Instructors (MOIs) to complete enclosure (1), between 30-60 days of officer applicants and midshipmen (MIDN) shipping to OCS. OSOs, MOIs, Service Academy Liaisons (SALs), and Program Managers (PMs) must complete enclosure (2) on Lieutenants before reporting to TBS, and enclosures (3) and (4) on candidates and MIDN before shipping to OCS and Lieutenants before reporting to TBS, as appropriate. These documents are completed in full, including physical fitness tests (PFTs), height and weight, and body fat percentages, to ensure the officer applicant, MIDN, and Lieutenant meets the established requirements before shipping/reporting. [For the remainder of this FROST Call "OCS Candidates" refers both to officer applicants and MIDN].

3. Information. The current operating environment necessitates modified in-processing at OCS and TBS. To support the effort of reducing risk to each pool, MCRC also has modified processing for OCS Candidates shipping to OCS and Lieutenants reporting to TBS.

- a. Enclosure (5) provides FY22 OCS shipping and completion dates.
- b. Enclosure (6) provides FY22 TBS report dates.
- c. Enclosure (7) provides FY23 OCS shipping and completion dates.
- d. Enclosure (8) provides FY23 TBS report dates.

4. Quarantine definition. Per the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and reference (b), quarantine separates and restricts the movement of people who were exposed to a contagious disease to see if they become sick. In keeping with CDC's standard, an applicant/poolee is considered to have met the requirements of quarantine if he/she has practiced social distancing, listened to and followed the directions of their state and local authorities, stayed home, avoided any non-essential travel, kept at least six feet away from other people in

public, avoided eating or drinking in restaurants, bars, and food courts, and avoided visiting nursing homes, retirement, or long-term care facilities.

5. Action. In adherence to reference (c) OSOs and MOIs will limit contact with OCS Candidates through the following actions:

a. OSOs and MOIs are authorized and encouraged to complete enclosures (1) and (2) telephonically.

b. The execution of the pre-ship PFT shall be conducted 30-60 days before shipping to OCS or reporting to TBS. Marine Corps PFT scoring tables and videos for the proper execution of each event, can be found at the following link: https://www.fitness.marines.mil/PFT-CFT_Standards17/. The last recorded PFT administered by an OSO/MOI, should reflect on enclosures (1) and (2) and be entered into the Marine Corps Recruiting Information Support System on the PFT tab. OSOs and MOIs will remind Candidates that OCS induction PFT standards remain 220 points and the passing of all three events. There will be no PFT retakes or induction boards. Similarly, Lieutenants reporting to TBS must achieve a minimum PFT score of 235 points to pick up with a training company.

c. Any OCS Candidate who has ever tested positive for COVID-19 - with particular emphasis on those who have tested positive within 90 days of shipping to OCS or reporting to TBS - must provide a copy of the positive test results to their OSO, MOI, or appropriate parent command representative. Additionally, Candidates are required to bring a hard copy of the results for inclusion in their medical records. If a Candidate tests positive upon arrival at OCS, and the proof of their previous positive result is not in hand, that Candidate will be processed for disenrollment.

d. OCS Candidates and Lieutenants will execute a 5-day self-quarantine as described in paragraph (4). During the quarantine, OCS Candidates and Lieutenants will provide a minimum of three self-administered temperature readings before arriving at OCS/TBS. OCS Candidates and Lieutenants will record their last reading within three days of reporting to OCS/TBS. All readings will be documented on enclosure (4). For candidates shipping to first increment or Officer Candidate Course Class 240 (OCC-240) / Platoon Leaders Class-Combined (PLC-C) Course, whose college schedules do not allow for a complete 5-day self-quarantine, will execute as much of a self-quarantine as feasible given their situation.

e. OSOs and MOIs will verify, to the best of their ability, all OCS Candidates and Lieutenants have completed enclosures (3) and (4) and instruct them to hand carry the enclosures to OCS/TBS.

f. OSOs and MOIs will direct any OCS Candidate and Lieutenant who displays a fever, displays symptoms consistent with COVID-19, cohabitates with an individual that tests positive for COVID-19, or fails to meet the 5-day self-quarantine period, not to ship OCS/TBS, and will report this to MCRC Officer Programs (OP) via the appropriate chain of command.

g. OCS Candidates who test positive for COVID-19 within 4 days of their respective ship date are not authorized to ship. To clarify, if an OCS Candidate tests positive for COVID-19, 5 days must take place before their assigned report date, or else they cannot ship. For First Increment [21 May 22 report date], if they test positive on or before 15 May 22, they are authorized to ship. If they test positive on 16 May 22 or later, they are not authorized to ship. For OCC-240 / PLC-C [28 May 22 report date], if they test positive on or before 22 May 22, they are authorized to ship. If they test positive on 23 May 22 or later, they are not authorized to ship. For Second Increment [2 Jul 22 report date], if they

test positive on or before 26 Jun 22, they are authorized to ship. If they test positive on 27 May 22 or later, they are not authorized to ship.

h. OCS Candidates will carry a hard copy of their vaccination card on their persons upon arrival to OCS - this applies to both fully and partially vaccinated candidates. Although OCS Candidates are not required to be vaccinated before arriving at OCS, all non-fully vaccinated candidates will receive the COVID-19 vaccine during medical in-processing. Candidates are **HIGHLY ENCOURAGED** to receive the vaccine before arriving at OCS to forestall the chance of experiencing any adverse symptoms from the vaccine during the period of instruction at OCS.

i. Marine Corps Districts will conduct 100% screening of pre-ship checklists per reference (a) and report accountability of completion of the Quarantine Attestation Screening Form to the appropriate region AOP. Recruiting Regions will screen at least 20% of all pre-ship checklists per reference (a) and send a roster of those individuals screened to MCRC OP Operations.

j. For OCS Candidates requiring Bureau of Medicine and Surgery recertification in order to gain their commission, OSOs, MOIs, SALs, and PMs shall refer to reference (d) for clarifying guidance.

6. Effective immediately, this FROST Call cancels FROST Call 058-20 and is active until further notice. MCRC OP will monitor the evolving situation and provide modification/updates, as required.
